800 mcg/g Ivermectin

Pharmaceutical form

Liquid Spot-On for topical application.

Pharmacological properties

XENO 450 is designed as a topical spot on for use on rabbits, guinea pigs, ferrets and birds. The active ingredient Ivermectin is a substance known as an endectocide because it kills parasites that cause infestation inside the body (endoparasites) as well as those living outside the body, on the skin (ectoparasites). Ivermectin is used in many species for the control of mites, roundworms and lice.

Clinical particulars

Target Species

Rabbits, Guinea Pigs, Ferrets and Birds over 800g bodyweight.

Indications for use

Prevents and treats common internal and external parasites of rabbits, guinea pigs, ferrets and birds.

Contra-indications

XENO 450 is only for use on rabbits, guinea pigs, ferrets and birds. Do not use in animals other than those indicated. Serious reactions including deaths have been reported in dogs (especially Collies, Old English Sheepdogs and related breeds), tortoises and turtles treated with the active substance.

Special precautions for use

If you are uncertain about the condition of your pet, consult a veterinary surgeon. If symptoms persist, consult a veterinary surgeon.

Use during pregnancy and lactation

No data available. Do not use in pregnant and lactating animals

Interaction with medicaments and other forms of interaction

None known.

Method of administration

Holding the pipette firmly in one hand, twist off the cap.

Mammals: Apply 1 tube (450 micrograms) per kg bodyweight onto the skin on the back of the neck and down the spine.

Birds: Apply 1 drop (22.5 micrograms) per 100g bodyweight under the feathers onto the skin of the back between the wings. Each tube contains approximately 20 drops.

SPECIES	BODYWEIGHT	AMOUNT TO USE
Guinea Pigs	800g to 1.2kg	1 tube
Ferrets	800g to 1.5kg	1 tube
Small or dwarf rabbits	Up to 1.5kg	1 tube
Medium rabbits	1.5kg to 3kg	2 tubes
Large rabbits	Over 3kg	3 tubes
Birds	Over 800g	1 drop per 100g

For routine prevention of common ectoparasites this dose should be repeated monthly. For the treatment of an existing infestation, repeat doses are required two weeks and four weeks after the initial application.

Special warnings for each target species

Do not overdose. Avoid use in or around the eyes. Occasional central nervous system disorders, lethargy, inappetance, local irritation and/or hypersensitivity reactions may be observed. These signs may be more common in young animals. Should such a reaction occur, discontinue use and seek veterinary advice. This product is toxic to chelonians. Do not use in tortoises, turtles or related species.

Withdrawal periods

Not applicable. For pet animals only. Do not use on animals intended for human consumption.

Special precautions to be taken by the person administering the product to animals

Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water following treatment.

For animal treatment only.

Special precautions for storage

Do not store above 25°C. Keep out of direct sunlight.
Keep out of reach of children.
After use, wrap empty pipettes in tissue paper and dispose with domestic refuse.

Nature and contents of container

Cartons containing 6 polypropylene tubes, each of 450mcg ivermectin.

Further information

This product is not effective against ringworm. Ringworm is a skin disease which can be passed on from your pet to humans.
